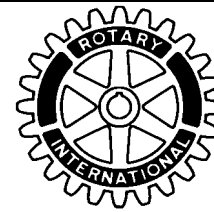

Happy 103rd Birthday Rotary!

The World's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, was founded on February 23, 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to capture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The Rotary name was derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices. Rotary's popularity spread, and within a decade, clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York to Winnipeg, Canada. By 1921, the year that the Rotary Club of Tullahoma was chartered, Rotary Clubs had been formed on six continents. Today, over 1.2 million Rotarians belong to over 32,000 Rotary Clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas.
